WHO WE ARE








This is measured using performance data from Ohio's State Tests.

End of Course Exams (EOC) are taken by students in the following courses at the end of each school year. ACPA met indicators and significantly outperformed state averages in three subjects.



FY23 FINANCIAL INFORMATION

On average, community schools in Ohio are funded at 2/3 the total funding of traditional district schools. ACPA accounts for this funding disparity with programmatic grants, careful and precise budgeting, and the help of generous donors. While being one of the community schools with the lowest per pupil allocations, ACPA is also historically one of the highest performing academically in Ohio, and offers a full arts curriculum when other schools are cutting the arts in short, ACPA does more with less.

operating expenses on classroom instruction.



COMMUNITY SCHOOL SPONSOR STATEMENT


