# Consent for Release of Student Information Form

### **Directory Information**

Directory Information is defined as student's name, student identification number, address, parent's telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities, height and weight (for costumes and graduation purposes), dates of attendance, date of graduation, awards received, honor rolls, and/or scholarships.

#### Photographs, Audio, Video, or Electronic Images

Student images may appear in photographs, audio, video, or electronic images used by ACPA for exhibition, public display, publications, publicity materials, advertising, news media story, class pictures, yearbooks, video, audio or electronic media, such as internet and television. I understand my student's name may be used with such a display. I understand that the school will make every attempt to work with the media, however, incidental photos and/or videos of students in some situations cannot be controlled.

# Original Works of Art and Written Materials

This applies to original written materials, artwork, or other work created by my student for external exhibition, public display, publication, publicity material, advertising, a news media story, video, audio, or other electronic media, such as the Internet, television, CD-ROM, or DVD. I understand that my student's name may also be shared with organizations or entities outside the district (such as CMA). NOTE: If consent is denied, such denial shall not apply where the student's material is incorporated into a greater or larger body of work (such as a student's voice in a large group choral recording).

#### Written Letters

This applies to participation in letter writing assignments as part of the educational experience to people outside the school district (thank-you letters, pen pals, letters to authors, or letters to public officials). Such letters may include the students first and last name and may include other personally identifiable information about the student.

## Internal Digital Sharing of Student Work

ACPA teachers frequently provide students the opportunity to present and perform in front of their classmates - the process of preparing and delivering a presentation (whether it be artistic or academic) is proven to motivate students and increase their confidence, among many other benefits. One of the great things about ACPA is its safe and accepting environment that allows all students to feel comfortable in these situations. To that end, ACPA is committed to extending this feeling of safety into the digital learning environment. During the 2024-2025 school year, students will share their work through the Schoology online learning management system. Schoology is a private and secure software where student work is shared through this platform and will only be viewable to students in their classes, just as if they were performing or sharing something in a typical classroom setting.
